

## **Brief: Delivering a level 3 qualification in speech, language and communication online**



### **Background – The Communication Trust**

The Communication Trust is a coalition of 47 voluntary and community organisations with expertise in speech, language and communication. We harness our collective expertise to support the children's workforce and commissioners to meet the speech, language and communication needs (SLCN) of all children and young people, particularly those who need extra help.

We do this by raising awareness, providing information and workforce development opportunities, influencing policy, promoting best practice among the children's workforce and commissioning work from our members. The Trust is advised by specialist advisors and works with a broader network of partners.

We were founded in 2007 by children's charities Afasic, I CAN, Council for Disabled Children and with support from BT.

### **Background - The project and the purpose**

In 2011 the Trust, in collaboration with City and Guilds, developed a Level 3 award Supporting Children and Young People's Speech, Language and Communication which is on the Qualifications and Credit Framework (QCF) (City & Guilds reference number: 4337 and CACHE 600/4257/6). The Communication Trust itself is not a training provider and so does not offer the training, but throughout 2012 we have been working with others including members of our consortium, local authorities and further education colleges to test various models of delivering the qualification. Despite our efforts, demand outstrips supply and over 700 people have told us that they would like to do the award but have been unable to access it.

In November 2012 the Trust applied to the Department for Education VCS grant scheme to test a model of delivering the qualification via e-learning and assessment. In February 2013 we were notified that we had been successful.

The aim of the project is to develop an accessible, cost-effective route for early years practitioners from a wide range of backgrounds to gain the qualification through an online route of learning, assessment and accreditation. This in turn will enable settings, through a better qualified workforce, to provide high quality early education in relation to children's language and communication.

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The 2 year pilot will:

- Enable practitioners to access the qualification across early years settings via not-for-profit online learning, assessment and accreditation
- Ensure a minimum of 230 pilot learners are enrolled on the award for accreditation
- Deliver a scalable and sustainable approach to nationwide delivery launched by March 2015 with mainstream routes of delivery in place

The current proposed partners in this project are:

- Puffin nursery group
- Lewisham local authority
- Central Bedfordshire Council
- City and Guilds; CACHE and Aptawards (formerly OCNSWR)

### The Award

The Award is an existing level 3 qualification (equivalent to A-Level). Learners must successfully complete three units – two mandatory units and one of a choice of four optional units. Each unit is 3 credits, apart from one of the optional units which is 4 credits. The award includes learning outcomes focusing on both skills and knowledge. 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### **Requirements**

The Trust requires the support of an external provider to work with us to provide an online solution to support learning, assessment and accreditation with the following specific criteria. It's important to note that a key requirement from the Department of Education is that the site is not 'completely new' and that it exists within or as part of a current portal.

In your proposal please describe how you would meet the following needs of the learners for our project:

- Online registration of cohorts of students by varying approved centres
- Access to online content
- Learn online with progress checks
- Online Assessment
- Online support from assessor to gain accreditation from an awarding body

### **Registration**

- Learners will register with a training provider (who is linked to one of the three awarding bodies) who will then register their cohort of students onto the course.
- Payment will be taken off line by the training provider
- Cohorts of learners will differ in size and will be starting on varying dates.
- Students will be expected to complete the award in a certain period of time as set by the training provider (allowing for exceptional circumstances). This should not disadvantage students but allow for efficient administration by training providers. The current thinking is around 6 months.

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### Learning

- We require an online learning platform where people can go and study their two mandatory units as well as their choice of optional unit.
- The content for the face to face courses has already been developed and this should be utilised where possible. In addition we have content expertise to support joint working on developing the online learning.
- Learning should be based on best practice for online/blended learning including :
  - ✓ Creating a supportive online community
  - ✓ Course discussion and reflection
  - ✓ Activities to allow the learners to apply and test their knowledge, understanding and skill
  - ✓ Accommodating feedback throughout the course
  - ✓ Linking content to learning objectives and outcomes
- We would like to offer flexibility for learners who have already undertaken learning elsewhere to be able to 'top up' their learning and then submit a portfolio of evidence for accreditation – i.e. a way to steer learners to the right content for them.

### Assessment and accreditation

- Training providers will link their learners to one or more assessors for the duration of their course
- Learners will be expected to complete assessments throughout the course which need to be marked by their assessor. Students should be able to upload these in connection to an element of the unit they are working on to develop an online portfolio of evidence.
- Assessors may set deadlines to complete work.
- Assessors must be able to provide online support and feedback remotely
- Assessors must be able to communicate with their students through the site (with this information being logged)
- Learners assessments will need to be verified before a learner can pass and be accredited for their award by their awarding body. Therefore verifiers must be able to access the learner's work as required.
- The issue of assessment in the workplace will also need to be discussed

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### **Administration/Additional information**

- As this is a new project, there are some aspects which will require further clarification and therefore flexibility

### **Branding/ Tone/ Composition**

The branding would follow The Communication Trust guidelines, the tone would follow the feel of all our materials and websites, therefore being accessible, easy to navigate and supportive. The composition must be easy to follow and accessible for all users. In the pilot phase, the main audience is people working in early education and care settings (children's centres, nurseries, pre-schools, childminders, speech and language assistants) but this will be extended to other practitioners at a later date.

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To assist you when putting together your proposal we have determined the following criteria and related this to a points scale to indicate the level of importance we place on each factor.
